#### **PRESENTATIONS**

# Chad Richmond Memorial Basketball Court – Richmond Family Appreciation

Dr. Davis and the Board of Education recognized Ms. Richmond for the planning and fundraising for the Chad Richmond Memorial Basketball Court. This project will provide long last benefits to the community and our students for many years to come.

## CTE Project - Evan Kelsey - VSWC

Mr. Evan Kelsey from VSWC provided an update to the Board on the Career Tech Education Innovation Space. The district applied and was awarded a grant for \$1.9M from the State of Ohio for Career Tech Education for construction and equipment. The new space will be located above the Elementary Media Center and the majority of the construction will take place in the Summer of 2025 with a planned opening in January 2025. The Elementary Media Center will not be available during this period. More details to come in the coming months.

# Curriculum Revision Cycle - Mark Edwards

Mr. Mark Edwards provided an in-depth curriculum update to the Board of Education, outlining the progress and plans for the district's curriculum revisions. He explained that the district is currently in year four of the curriculum cycle, with science undergoing its revision process this year. Mr. Edwards detailed the revised order of curriculum adoption, which now includes math, social studies, ELA, and science. This change allows the primary building to avoid implementing two major curricula back-to-back, easing the load on teachers.

Mr. Edwards described the curriculum revision cycle, highlighting that the first year involves investigating and selecting materials, followed by implementation in the second year, and data collection in subsequent years to assess effectiveness. He emphasized the importance of formative assessments to evaluate both students understanding and the quality of instruction. The focus this year is on refining



teaching practices and addressing any gaps in curriculum or instruction based on performance data.

In addition to the curriculum updates, Mr. Edwards highlighted initiatives related to the "Science of Reading," with teachers across all grades receiving training through state-funded modules. He also mentioned a grant from the University of Cincinnati that provides a literacy coach and additional training for teachers to enhance reading comprehension and vocabulary acquisition.

Other key updates included the expansion of curriculum map integration, where assessments are linked and tracked to improve instructional outcomes. Additionally, Mr. Edwards discussed efforts to expand career-based learning opportunities, including internships and work-based learning. One notable partnership is with the Talbert House, offering paid internships and certifications in behavioral health, allowing students to gain both credentials and employment opportunities directly out of high school. The District is also working with the Home Builders Association on construction trade workshops, adding another career pathway for students.
